

LIBRARY MATTERS

"Secrets of Drawing: Start to Finish" - Craig Nelson

We have a few new books that will be available at the next meeting, courtesy of Nadja Martinussen, one of our newest members. Thank you also for the online gallery added to the website, Nadja, you are very much appreciated.

In anticipation of the life drawing session on Friday, 17 October, at Canvas and Craft in Tableview, I decided to review one of the new books entitled, "Secrets of Drawing: Start to Finish" by Craig Nelson. Initially it was only to decide which medium to use at Canvas and Craft, but of course, as always I learned something new.

A new technique I want to try, is using oil pastel smeared with a brush and turpentine. He also introduced Vallum to me, which seems to be a lovely surface for dry drawing mediums like pastel. Apparently it is smooth, yet it looks to hold on to a lot of pigment powder. He recommends acid free surfaces to ensure a longer life for your art and to ensure you are aware of the permanence of the medium used.

Mr Nelson is highly skilled when it comes to lines, even when working with charcoal or a brush and ink, his style is linear and structured. I therefore found the different ways in which he indicated tone or value very interesting: altering the angles of hatching lines, using washes with inks, charcoal, pastels and watercolour pencils and just using more line, but delicately and sparsely placed. However values are indicated, editing out detail is key to render a readable drawing made predominantly with line.

October Speaker Kyle Jardine




Drawing from his experience in stage performance, drag culture and his queer identity, Jardine constructs a beautifully wild, weird and fantastical safe space to immerse oneself in.


